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The South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI) wishes to appoint a Service Provider who will be responsible for the production of the annual report for the next two years, starting in 2018/19 till 2019/20. The selected Service Provider will be responsible for the development and design and layout of the SANBI Annual Report, newsletters, brochures, adverts and booklets. The service will require significant contact time in the SANBI's Pretoria offices as soon as the Service Provider is appointed.

1. Background to the Annual Report Production

On 1 September 2004 the South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI) was established in terms of the National Environmental Management Biodiversity Act (NEMBA), No. 10 of 2004. The Act expanded the mandate of SANBI's forerunner, the National Botanical Institute (NBI) to include responsibilities relating to the full diversity of South Africa's fauna and flora, and build on the internationally respected programmes in conservation, research, education and visitor services developed over the past century by the NBI. SANBI has a broad mandate that is primarily derived from the NEMBA, but also from other legislation and processes over the past decade. The mandate is to explore, reveal, celebrate and champion biodiversity for the benefit and enjoyment of all South Africans which includes managing the National Botanical Gardens (NBG) as 'windows' to South Africa's biodiversity for enjoyment and education.

In addition to managing the National Botanical Gardens, SANBI plays a leadership role in generating, coordinating and interpreting the knowledge and evidence required to support policies and decisions relating to all aspects of biodiversity. SANBI's science forms part a value chain that starts with baseline information on biodiversity and builds on these foundations with assessments, experiments, models and

tools. In this way we can influence policy makers and contribute to Government's higher objectives of poverty alleviation, job creation and improving human wellbeing.

In terms of its legislative mandate, the Institute viz. South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI) is required to produce newsletters, brochures, adverts, booklets and an annual report to be tabled in Parliament by 31 August of each year according to the "Guide for the Preparation of Annual Reports for Public Entities" as set out by National Treasury.

2. Objectives

The SANBI annual report will provide information on the financial health of SANBI to shareholders, stakeholders, media and community.

- Editing of the annual report content
- Design and layout of cover page and content pages

5. Timeframe

6. Budget
