1. INVITATION TO QUOTE

Quotations are hereby invited for the provision of cleaning services to the BRAM rental office in Vincent. The quote process will be co-ordinated by SANBI's Supply Chain Management (SCM) Directorate.

2. BACKGROUND

The South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI) requires an Office Cleaning Service Provider to provide cleaning services at the SANBI Rental offices located at 4a Princess Road. Vincent, East London.

SANBI staff from the BRAM division in the EC are occupying rental office space at 4a Princess Road. Vincent, East London, that require the services of office cleaning service provider three times a week.

3.1 SERVICES REQUIRED

3.1.1 CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE OF 3 OFFICES, 1 KITCHEN, 1 BATHROOM, 1 RECEPTION AREA AND 1 HALLWAY/PASSAGE.

Office size, ~ 67 M²

- Apply furniture polish, dusting furniture, equipment, and surfaces
- Cleaning windows, doors, and walls where necessary
- Cleaning ablutions including toilets, basins, and mirrors
- Cleaning kitchen utensils and ensuring their proper storage after use
- Maintaining general cleanliness and hygiene in all designated areas
- Sweeping, mopping and vacuuming floors and including outside area
- Wash floors in the kitchen, bathroom, and offices
- Wipe kitchen surfaces and work areas
- Wipe door handles, toilet seats, skirting boards, and window seals
- Wash staff dishes after teatime and lunchtime

3.1.2 CUSTOMER AND VISITOR SERVICE

- Always act professionally to garden visitors and staff daily

3.1.3 STOCK MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL

- Keep all cleaning equipment in good, clean, and working condition
- Use cleaning materials responsibly and avoid unnecessary waste
- Ensure cleaning supplies are stored in designated and appropriate areas
- Comply with the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHASA), relevant legislation, and regulations
- Assess risks when performing cleaning duties and minimise them as far as possible
- Proactively identify and report potential risks immediately
- Store all cleaning materials safely and in the correct containers
- Ensure no cleaning equipment or materials are left unattended in a way that may pose a hazard to staff or visitors

4. COMPLAINTS, CONTACTS AND MEETINGS

- Both the Service Provider and SANBI will draw up a Service Level Agreement (SLA) for monitoring and compliance purposes. The SLA will be monitored through compliance meetings which will be held monthly. The Service Provider will also meet the designated SANBI representative as and when it deems necessary.

5. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Service Provider must ensure that its staff members comply with the rules, regulations and bylaws of the site, which will be covered during the induction.

5.1 CLEANING MATERIAL AND EQUIPMENT

The service provider will provide all cleaning chemicals and equipment required for the delivery of the cleaning services.

Contractors must supply cleaning materials as listed below:

- Vacuum cleaner, mop, bucket and brooms.
- 24 rolls of 2 ply toilet paper and replenish when finished.

5.2 UNIFORMS

Staff must be provided with their own proper uniforms and be neatly presented at all times.

5.3 SUPERVISION OF WORK

The Service Provider will supervise and exercise proper control over its personnel and shall not hold SANBI liable for any loss or injury suffered by such personnel. The Service Provider will address and resolve any personnel-related matters in accordance with applicable legislation. SANBI will provide minimal supervision, which will be undertaken in liaison with the Service Provide.

5.4 RESPONSIBILITIES

The Service Provider will take responsibility for the following:

- Provision of transportation for its own staff.
- Provision of all personal protective equipment (PPE) and compliance with all Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHASA) requirement
